Renovations are underway to recycle the old AMVETS building, into a "Community Center" for our area's growing senior population, the upcoming "Baby Boomers" and their families. Completed and future projects include:

- Enhanced accessibility with all-weather entry, improved restrooms and elevator
- Emphasis on Wellness with Fitness/Exercise facilities, health screenings, services and more
- Lounge area for relaxing and socializing
- Expanded recreational opportunities inside and out, including cards, Wii, walking track, Pickleball and more
- Centralized "chore services"
